Each semester City College will provide BMCC the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:*

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and on the City College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
