B. Admission Requirements for Senior College Program

(e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio)

At the completion of the A.S. degree in Education, Childhood Option at Bronx Community College students must first do the Transfer Application for admission into CCNY. Early application deadlines are as follows:

- September 15 for spring admission
- February 1 for fall admission

After admission into CCNY, students are encouraged to connect with advisement for guidance regarding admission into the program. Admission requirements prepare you for the expectations of the teaching profession in New York State. The criteria for formal admission in the School of Education are:

- Submit SoE Admissions Application
- Earn a City College grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Complete 45 credits or more - students must complete twelve of these credits at CCNY including EDCE 20000, a required education course within the Childhood Undergraduate Education Program.
- Pass the School of Education Admissions Test (S.E.A.T.)
- Pass a program Interview and Essay.

Candidates for the Associate in Science Degree from Bronx Community College:

Determination of the 60 Liberal Arts credits required for the baccalaureate degree in accordance with New York State Education Department requirements will be made by City College.

Bronx Community College graduates with the Education, Childhood Option (A.S.) will receive 60 credits toward a Bachelor of Science in Childhood Education. In addition, their coursework at Bronx Community College will be deemed to have fulfilled all lower division General Education Pathways requirements for the CCNY Bachelor of Science in Education degree.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate* degree: 60

**In order to complete the BSEd in Childhood Education in 60 credits after transfer to City College, students must follow all suggestions in this articulation agreement.*

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement

Bronx Community College and City College faculty will review implementation of the agreement once every four years to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success

After transfer into City College, the performance of Bronx Community College students will be tracked using the CUNY Institutional Research Database. The City College Office of Institutional Research will inform BCC about the academic progress of transfer students. Additionally, these students will be surveyed after graduation from City to determine educational and occupational experience and success, and City will share this information with BCC.

City College provides advisement to all students entering the major.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.

Notice of articulation will be placed in the respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, and websites.

Respective transfer and academic advisers will be informed and provided with copies of this agreement.

City College Admissions Office will make certain that materials are sent with recruitment officers for BCC's biannual Transfer Day event.


