As you may know, our Division stands out as the only one in the College with a degree approved for entirely online delivery. In addition, we are excited to announce that the University and Albany have approved a new **BA in Urban Life and Social Justice**, which will be available starting in Spring 2025.

As I informed you in my last communication, we have finished upgrading the Auditorium and two big classrooms to offer online/hyflex classes. Also, every single classroom is upgraded with the latest technology and all new podiums. In addition, we upgraded the computer lab with new computers in order to offer new programs. I wish to recognize **Robert Hernandez** and his team for their work on this.

Now some news on our Division activities. You will see through these pages what we have been doing. In April, we had the **Third International Conference on Human Rights**, an extremely successful conference with over 100 participants from 25 countries. We also had the **Eleventh Edition of The Americas International Film Festival of New York (TAFFNY)**, in collaboration with the Smithsonian Indian Museum and Instituto Cervantes, with record attendances. For the next academic year, we are planning three major events: in November, the **First International Multilingual Creative Writing Conference (MCWC)** with thanks to Prof. **Carlos Aguasaco** who is working on this new initiative; in April, the **Tenth Historical LINKS Conference**; and in the spring, the **First IN SHORT Student Video Competition** - with thanks to **Lorena De Miranda Marques** for this new project.

My congratulations to our students **Lucero Saavedra Huerta** (2023), and **Sena Tossou** (2024) who both won \$10,000 scholarships from the Women's Forum of New York Education Fund, as well as to the Class of 2024 Salutatorian **Tiffany Ramirez Duncan** and Valedictorian **Christanya Symplice**. We also remember with fondness **Shania Grosvenor**, one of our students who passed away recently. Her spirit and contributions to our community will be deeply missed.

I would like to recognize Professor **Martin Woessner** for publication of his bestselling book "*Terrence Malick and the Examined Life*," and his promotion to Full Professor. In the fall semester, we plan to have a series of book presentations by our own faculty. Additionally, congratulations to Professors Danielle Zach, Séamus Scanlon, Susanna Rosenbaum, and Joan Robinson on winning PSC-CUNY Awards.

I would like to welcome the new faculty and staff to the CCNY CWE family:

Beyond textbooks, this program offers students real-life learning experiences and provides an interdisciplinary framework for analyzing social justice issues and inequality within urban communities. Students will embark on a scaffolded journey that blends coursework, experiential learning, and public lectures, culminating in a capstone research project and presentation.







RECURRING EVENT

The Americas Poetry Festival of New York (TAPFNY) held its tenth multilingual poetry festival in 2023, in New York City. Eleven years of organizing a film festival like the Americas Film Festival of New York (TAFFNY) is an exhilarating journey filled with countless lessons and moments of inspiration. At TAFFNY, we deeply believe that true openness and societal transformation begins when minorities take the lead. Many of us are migrants who have discovered a vibrant haven for our ideas and beliefs in this dynamic city. We proudly represent the LGBTQ+ community, Indigenous groups, and women's empowerment movements, united in our mission to highlight the importance of diversity and inclusion. These principles are not just slogans—they are the very foundation of our actions.

With each passing year, we've grown to understand our audience better. We now have loyal followers eagerly anticipating our annual gathering of film enthusiasts and critics, who are always on the lookout for the latest trends in Latin American and Native American filmmaking. We've also learned to push and redefine boundaries by selecting films that address both contemporary and historical issues in ways that are more creative and insightful than mainstream cinema. Our festival fosters dialogues that would not occur otherwise, bridging filmmakers and New Yorkers in meaningful conversations.

This year, TAFFNY spanned eight venues across Midtown, Hell's Kitchen, West Village, Chelsea, and Battery Park. Being Pride Month, we also featured powerful narratives from the LGBTQIA+ communities.

None of this would be possible without the tenacity and conviction of the Dean of the Division of Interdisciplinary Studies at City College Downtown, Prof. Juan Carlos Mercado. Our long-time partners, including the Cervantes Institute NY, The National Museum of the American Indian, the Consulate General of Argentina in NY and numerous other wonderful organizations such as NYU's Caribbean and Latin American Studies (CLACS), La Nacional Spanish Benevolent Society and Manhattan Neighborhood Network, have been instrumental in our success.
