B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Graduates of the Guttman Community College A.A. in Liberal Arts – Humanities and Social Sciences track will qualify for admission into the CUNY City College Bachelor of Arts degree in Interdisciplinary Liberal Arts and Sciences if they:

- Have maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 and are in good academic standing at Guttman Community College
- Have a Grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course
- Successful completion of a 3-credit college-level math course with a grade of C or better
- As part of the Intersiplinary Liberal Arts and Sciences program, no transfer application will be needed. Students will instead respond to outreach from the City College's Division of Interdisciplinary Studies Admissions Office indicating their intent to attend City College the following semester.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Guttman Community College graduates who complete the A.A. in Liberal Arts – Humanities and Social Sciences track will receive 60 credits toward the B.A. in Interdisciplinary Liberal Arts and Sciences at City College.

Transferred credits will be applied to the Baccalaureate degree as professional credits, course specific transfer credits

and electives. Students will meet with a City College advisor who will review their transcripts to ensure appropriate placement within the program. Taking recommended flexible core courses will assure that students need only 60 additional credits for their bachelor's degree at City College.

F ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW - UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating the agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by a representative from each institution’s respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program coordinators.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Annually, the City College Institutional Research Database will provide Guttman Community College with the following information: a) the number of Guttman students who were accepted into the program, b) the number of

Guttman students who enrolled, and c) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Guttman and City College websites. Transfer advisors at Guttman will promote this agreement with eligible students.

E. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Transfer students are eligible to apply for financial aid that is normally available to other junior standing students.

Students who register for a minimum of 12 credits per semester are eligible for all federal and state grant programs for which they meet income eligibility requirements.


