Joyce Carol Oates is one of the most prolific writers in American literary history. She has written novels, short stories, children's literature, detective, horror, drama, poetry, literary criticism, and nonfiction. Oates is a recipient of the National Book Critics Circle Lifetime Achievement Award, the National Book Award, the PEN / Malamud Award, the LA Times Book Award and the Jerusalem Prize among others. In 2010, she received the National Book Critics Circle's Ivan Sandrof Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2011, she received the National Humanities Medal "for her contributions to American letters." And since 2012 she is the Roger S. Berlind Distinguished Professor of the Humanities at Princeton University and has been a member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters since 1978.
