A. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

General Basic Requirements:

Completion of the **A.A degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences (Latina/o, Latin American, and Caribbean Studies Option)** from **Hostos Community College**

Transfer of Credit from **Eugenio María de Hostos College** to the **City College of New York**

- Graduates of **Hostos Community College** with the associate degree in **Liberal Arts – Latina/o, Latin American, and Caribbean Studies Option** who select the courses specified in this articulation agreement will receive **60** contributory transfer credits toward the **CCNY Bachelor of Arts in Area Studies - Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration** at the **City College of New York**, including **up to 12 credits toward the major requirements**.
- In addition, they will be deemed to have met all Required Core and Flexible Core Pathways requirements at City College.

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: **60**

Total credits required to earn the **DEGREE** in **MAJOR: 120**

B. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

- When any of the programs undergo any changes relevant to this agreement, this articulation agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by program directors of each institution's department, selected by their respective Chairpersons to represent them.
- At the end of academic year the various representatives of each institution as indicated above will review the performance of transfer students to determine if adjustment to, or termination of the articulation agreement, is needed.

This articulation agreement will be publicized on both the Hostos Community College and City College websites. Transfer advisers at HCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

ADVISOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Hostos Community College students who plan to transfer into the BA degree in Area Studies/Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration at City College are advised to strictly follow the Program Requirements and Program Electives listed in the proposal to satisfy the requirements for the Associates degree in Liberal Arts/Latina/o, Latin American, and Caribbean Studies option at HCC and to ensure that the maximum number of credits and required coursework are transferred to satisfy the Area Studies/Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration requirements at CCNY. Refer to both college websites and college catalogs/bulletins for a list of Pathways general education requirements for both the Hostos Liberal Arts/Latina/o, Latin American, and Caribbean Studies Option and CCNY Area Studies/Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration programs.



C. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:



PURPOSE: City College and Hostos Community College hereby enter into this agreement is to facilitate the opportunity for students who wish to transfer from Hostos Community College's Associate's Degree in Liberal Arts/Latina/o, Latin American, and Caribbean Studies Option to City College Bachelor of Arts Degree in Area Studies/Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration. The attached sections A, B, and C, of this agreement specify the conditions and requirements for admittance to City College. Sections D and E outline the curriculum for the A.A. and B.A. degrees and contain the course to course equivalencies between the Liberal Arts/Latina/o, Latin American and Caribbean Studies program at Hostos Community College, CUNY and the Area Studies/Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration at City College.

CHANGES: Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies and curricula (i.e. admission, curriculum, and degree requirements, course numbers, course content, and/or catalog descriptions by either party), must be communicated in writing to the other party, and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed-upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement. *It is highly recommended that the department chairs the respective college programs jointly complete sections A, B, and C of this agreement at least every two years.*

NOTICE OF CANCELLATION: Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation. City College agrees to accept into the Bachelors of Arts degree program in Area Studies /Latin American and Latino/a Studies Concentration from Hostos Community College who successfully complete the Liberal Arts/Latina/o, Latin American and Caribbean Studies Option curriculum and degree requirements described in section A, B, and C of this agreement; thereby receiving an Associates of Arts degree.

¹ 12 Credits maximum transferable to the CCNY B.A. in Area Studies – Latin American and Latino Studies Concentration at CCNY: 3 credits for LAC 101/LAS 12600 + 9 additional credits of courses counted toward the LAC option in the A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences at HCC. Additional courses completed at HCC or another college beyond those specified in this agreement and exceeding 60 credits will be counted toward the Unrestricted Elective requirement at CCNY. LALS majors must complete 60% of major courses at CCNY to fulfill the major residency requirement.

² Students may also satisfy all or part of the CCNY College Option requirement through foreign language study at HCC and/or by taking PHI 100 at HCC or by passing the CCNY Foreign Language Proficiency Exam.

³ Assumes completion of required course LALS 12600 Latin American Migration to the U.S. as LAC 101 at HCC and 9 additional credits of major courses. Refer to CCNY course equivalencies to Hostos major courses of pages 5-6 of this agreement. 60% of major courses must be taken at CCNY to fulfill the major residency requirement. Depending on the course credits transferred, additional courses in the major may be required.

⁴ The number of unrestricted elective credits the student will need to take at City College to complete 120 credits can vary depending on credits transferred.
